A. Magnolia Street Update

Vice Mayor Johnson recused himself from this discussion.

Administrator Eckert gave an update on the progress of plans to improve the surface of Magnolia Street.

Daryl Dye, Electric/Public Works Superintendent, described the temporary fix that would include sweeping the surface and using emulsion to fill the holes. He is working with the City's engineer to develop a more permanent solution.

The residents of Magnolia were in favor of any progress toward a more drivable surface. Many voiced their concerns as well as appreciation for the efforts being done to improve the surface. Those speaking were Jack McDowell of 1870 Magnolia, Carolyn Harr of 1820 Magnolia, Manuel Reyes of 1845 Magnolia, Octavio Avalos of 1865 Magnolia and Jennifer Olsen of 1835 Magnolia.

B. Oroville Spillway Incident Update

Administrator Eckert gave a power point presentation that reviewed the events surrounding the Oroville Spillway Incident. Also speaking were Fire Chief Chris Haile, IT Manager Mike Hensley, Electric/Public Works Superintendent Daryl Dye and Police Chief Dean Price. Eckert thanked Council for their support during the crisis and also praised the work and dedication of the staff and crews that made themselves available.
