Recommendation

City staff respectfully recommends Gridley City Council approve the referenced resolution that would allow City Administrator to submit applications for federal transportation assistance through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), pursuant to 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, Title 23 of the United States Code, and other applicable statutes.

Background

The Gridley Feather Flyer currently provides vital Dial-a-Ride transportation services to all residents within the City of Gridley. Our service is inclusive and fully ADA-compliant, ensuring equitable access for individuals with disabilities and mobility challenges.

However, our existing vehicle is aging and has required multiple costly repairs over the past year. During repair periods, we lack a backup vehicle, which leads to service interruptions and prevents us from reliably meeting the transportation needs of our community. Although we are scheduled to receive a second vehicle from BCAG, it is a high-mileage, used vehicle that may not offer the reliability needed for consistent service.

To improve reliability and reduce maintenance costs, we are seeking grant funding to assist in the purchase of two new ADA-compliant vehicles for our Feather Flyer service. These new vehicles would ensure continuity of service, reduce the risk of breakdowns, and better serve the mobility needs of Gridley residents.

The grant requires a 20% local match, which we are prepared to meet with using State Transit Assistance (STA) and/or Local Transportation Funds (LTF).

Fiscal Impact

Since January 2024, the Feather Flyer has incurred \$12,971.09 in repair costs alone, and our maintenance records reveal a consistent upward trend in expenses. If awarded, this grant would significantly reduce ongoing repair costs and improve overall service reliability. The grant

requires a 20% local match, which we estimate to be approximately \$30,000 - \$40,000. We intend to utilize STA and/or LTF funds to fulfill the match requirement.

WHEREAS, the grant or cooperative agreement for federal financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, and may require the applicant to provide the local share of the project cost; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has or will provide all annual certifications and assurances to the Federal Transit Administration required for the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the City Council of the City of Gridley as follows:

- 1. That the City Administrator is authorized to execute and file an application for federal assistance on behalf of the City of Gridley with the Federal Transit Administration for federal assistance authorized by 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, title 23, United States Code, or other federal statutes authorizing a project administered by the Federal Transit Administration.
- 2. That City Administrator, Finance Director, or Assistant Finance Director is authorized to execute and file with its applications the annual certifications and assurances and other documents the Federal Transportation Administration requires before awarding a federal assistance grant or cooperative agreement.
- 3. That City Administrator is authorized to execute grant and cooperative agreements with the Federal Transit Administration on behalf of the City of Gridley.

Subject: Approval to Submit Grant Applications to CalRecycle for Any Eligible Programs on

Behalf of the City of Gridley

Recommendation

City staff respectfully recommends Gridley City Council approve the referenced resolution authorizing City Staff to submit grant applications to CalRecycle for any eligible programs on behalf of the City of Gridley.

Background

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers a program to provide opportunities for the beverage container recycling and litter cleanup activities. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 14581 (a)(3)(A) of the California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act, CalRecycle is distributing \$10,500,000 in fiscal year 2025-26 to eligible cities and counties specifically for beverage container recycling and litter cleanup activities.

The availability of grant funding for communities will provide opportunities for CalRecycle to address recycling challenges, aid in increasing beverage container collection, and reduce beverage container litter in the waste stream. Gridley is an eligible applicant for this grant program. CalRecycle is seeking projects that implement new or enhance existing programs to provide convenient beverage container recycling opportunities in various locations statewide.

Gridley is eligible to receive a minimum of \$5,000 the payments are calculated based upon the population as of January 1, in the incorporated areas of a city, as stated in the annual E-1 Cities, Counties and the State Population Estimates with Annual Percentage Change.

Eligible costs include:

- Bins/Litter Reduction
 - Purchase of:
 - Beverage container recycling bins.
 - Permanently-attached, multi-material recycling bins that include beverage container recycling.
 - Litter reduction activities that include recycling beverage containers.
- Water Refill Stations

- Expenses to install or replace water refill station infrastructure, plumbing, maintenance, attachments, education & outreach, or modifications.
- Advertising/Promotion
 - o Send materials for prior approval from your CalRecycle Regional Representative.
- Education/Outreach
 - o Send materials for prior approval from your CalRecycle Regional Representative.
- California Resource Recovery Association Conference
 - o Limited to registration and travel for no more than 2 staff.
- Personnel Hours
 - o The Program funds only direct time for increasing beverage container recycling.
- Litter Clean-up Events
 - Must include beverage containers as part of the waste stream and to be recycled.
 - o The program may fund supplies, personnel, and safety items.

Fiscal Impact

No fiscal impact other than staff time. There is no match, the \$5,000 will be awarded and spent on eligible items.
